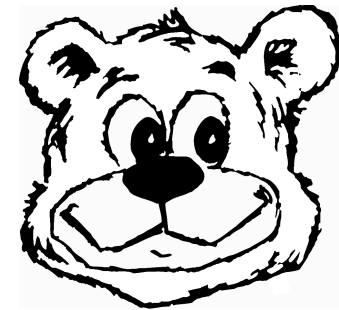

- Depend on us to believe in it and use it!

GOALS FOR STUDENT LEARNING

District Goals:

- To improve the percentage of students scoring proficient (levels 3,4) in grades 3 through 8
- To improve the percentage of students graduating from high school.

School Goals: The percentage of students performing at a level 3 or 4 in English language arts on the GA Milestones test will increase from 48% to 54% this year.

In 3rd grade our school will focus on:

- Reading fluency

The percentage of students performing at a level 3 or 4 in mathematics on the GA Milestones test will increase from 44% to 50% this year.

In 3rd grade our school will focus on:

- Number sense and Base 10

BES 3rd Grade Students

BES students joined staff to develop ideas about how they can succeed. Students thought of the following ideas to make connections between learning at home and school.

Students said:

- **Read at home for 10-20 minutes a night.**
- **Study math facts nightly using strategies learned in class and online tools like IXL and Xtra Math.**
- **Take home my agenda, homework and communication folders and AR books to share with my family members what I am learning and what is going on at my school.**

The 3rd Grade teachers

will work with students and their families to support student success.

Some of our key connections with families will be to:

- Send home STAR math and ELA benchmark reports.
- Provide weekly comprehension passages to practice with parents that will build students' comprehension and writing skills.
- Send home weekly math facts practice and website information for families to work on together.

At Home

BES parents joined staff to develop ideas about how families can support student success. Here are some things family members believe will show their support of their student's learning:

- I will keep in contact with my child's teacher through phone, e-mail, online, or face-to-face conversations regarding my child's academic achievements in reading/math/language arts, etc.
- I will check my child's backpack and agenda daily; sign and return weekly communication folders.
- I will listen or read to my child every night for 20 minutes.
