BES 5th Grade Students

BES students joined staff and parents to develop ideas about how they can succeed. Students thought of the following ideas to make connections between learning at home and school.

Students said:

- Listen in class each day and read AR books weekly at home to help me reach my AR goals.
- Complete math homework nightly
- Use strategies learned in class to help me complete assignments

The 5th Grade teachers

will work with students and their families to support student success. Some of our key connections with families will be:

- Communicate with parents with weekly take home folders which contain graded work. Provide resources to use at home if requested by parent/guardian
- Sending home MAP math and reading benchmark reports.
- Inform parents weekly of their child's progress with Lexile Levels and AR comprehension percentage.

At Home

BES parents joined staff to develop ideas about how families can support student success. Here are some things family members believe will show their support of their student's learning:

- I will read at home with my child and practice reading skills such as learning sight words, vocabulary words, fluency and reading.
- I will practice math facts with my child.
- I will read the class newsletter so that I am informed of what will be taught and will give me the ability to help my child learn at home.
